Disaster preparedness

• INF's Disaster Response and Resilience team set out for a 10-day long trip to Kapilvastu and Rolpa districts to conduct three two-day workshops on the Preparation of Disaster and Climate Change Management Policy at the local government level. Workshops were actively participated by government representatives, police officers and other interested residents from the local community. The workshop also saw the handing over of basic first aid kits to the local government. Workshops were led by Karna Bahadur Gurung and other facilitators included Jyoti Chhetri, Chullu Chaudhary, Hari Sharan Adhikari. Field reporting was done by Sahara Mishra.



• INF's IIFS has started to participate in a popular weekly farmer's market in Lakeside, Pokhara with its organic produce and handicrafts. Occasions like this provide an opportunity to increase awareness of INF's work, broaden existing networks and widen the market for selling products that help with INF's sustainable income generation. Orders have already started coming in! The farmer's market, behind Dorje's Restaurant, runs every Saturday from 10 AM to 1 PM.

16-Day Campaign Against Gender-Based Violence

- The 16-day campaign began on 25th November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and ran until 10th December, World Human Rights Day. INF supported and actively participated in the Campaign Against Gender-Based Violence.
- In Pokhara, the Federal Ministry of Women, Children and Senior Citizens of Gandaki Province organised a interaction programme which was supported by INF Nepal.
- The guest of honour was National Assembly Chairman, Ganesh Prasad Timilsina. Women, Children and Senior Citizen Minister Tham Maya Thapa; Deputy Speaker of Gandaki Province, Srijana Sharma; and provincial parliament members participated in the programme. Local government and other organisations were also represented, joining more than 350 people involved in the programme.
- Similarly, INF's Banke team also celebrated this campaign by organising signature collection campaign, candle lighting at the main city centre of Nepalgunj. The team also organised a small orientation programme for the staff and coordination meeting with the local government representative of Raptisonari RM.
