COMMUNITY

In rural and remote areas, INF brings people together to take collective action to address poverty and exclusion in their communities. We work with the most vulnerable, including women and people with disabilities, so that their voices are heard.

PLEASE PRAY

- for the large number of local self-help groups that are taking action and advocating to tackle challenges in health, education, sanitation, livelihoods, sustainability and human rights
- for INF's provision of treatment, physiotherapy and assistive devices to help people with disabilities; pray that our disability advocacy training would see people with disabilities empowered to play an active role in their communities
- for the POWER program as it seeks to advance the status, rights and leadership of women in Nepal

DISASTER RESPONSE & RESILIENCE

INF has developed a specialist disaster response and resilience team to respond to emergencies such as earthquakes and landslides. Poor and marginalised communities are most affected so INF is working with communities to recover in the longer-term, and prepare for future disasters.

PLEASE PRAY

- for INF's emergency response work in coordination with local government and other organisations, providing food, shelter, hygiene products and health care to address immediate needs, prevent the spread of disease and promoting safety
- for our work alongside communities as they recover from disasters, and rebuild their homes and livelihoods
- for INF's partnership with local authorities and community groups, including churches, to prepare them for disasters, build resilience and train them in effective response

HEALTH

INF's Green Pastures Hospital and Rehabilitation Centre [GPHRC], and our other hospitals and clinics provide quality care for patients who are poor or marginalised.
